In the scripture this week, John 4:4-24 we see Jesus interacting with a woman from a very different cultural, religious, and moral background from His own. Just how he does it is quite amazing. He doesn't straighten her out. He finds common ground and speaks to her as a person and to her deepest need.

Questions.

1. Do you have a God story from this week? (Note: It could be something very small).
2. The sermon was about the “Woman at the Well.” What from this sermon impacted you most?
3. I said, “Jesus knows you as a person and we all want that desperately. It's a wonderful thing to be known and to be accepted for who you are.”
 - When in your life have you experienced God's presence in a way that you thought, “God, you really know me for who I am?”
 - In your life, who are the people who have really known you well and accepted you for who you are?
 - In what ways has each of them impacted you?
 - In what areas of your life do you wish for greater intimacy? Where do you feel like you are alone?

I really want you to have a serious time of heart felt prayer. If you can go around the room with each individual praying out loud that would be really good. Here is an idea:
